**Calgary, Alberta** – (TSX: ESN.UN) Essential Energy Services Trust (the "Trust" or "Essential") is pleased to announce that it has finalized arrangements for its credit facilities with the National Bank of Canada and TD Commercial Banking. Essential has secured a \$40 million revolving acquisition facility, as well as an additional \$15 million revolving operating line, which provides the Trust with significant flexibility in moving forward with current operations, which may include additional strategic acquisitions.

Essential is an energy service trust that provides a range of essential production services to oil and gas producers across western Canada from northeast British Columbia to southwest Saskatchewan including service rigs, coil tubing, rod rigs, swab rigs, vacuum truck, pressure truck, tank truck, hydro-vac, steaming and hot oiling along with other related services. Essential focuses on post drilling production maintenance and enhancement services to ensure stable cash flows for Essential's unitholders.
